Hazard & Risk Assessment	Safety Precautions
Did you sign in (register) yet?	Practices require all participants to sign in and show required memberships
Firearm Transport - Restricted PAL	Do you have your Restricted PAL? Do you have your ATT paperwork (this is the shooters responsibility) Transport firearm to & from in a safe manner.
Valid Membership & AEF / SEF	Do you have a valid CCMSA, AMSA,BCSS,SCMSA & AEF / SEF
First Aid on site	Know where the first aid bag is located & eye wash bottle is located DO YOU KNOW THE 911 ADDRESS FOR THE SITE YOU ARE AT?
Loading Area	Gun loading area is ONLY for participants with restricted PAL. NEVER LEAVE GUNS UNATTENDED.
No Live Ammunition on site	No live ammunition to be on site ever. Black power blanks only.
Firearm	All firearms will be treated as if they are loaded at all times
Passing a firearm from one individual to the another	Firearm must be passed in a SAFE manner.
Armed Firearm	Carry firearm on empty chamber, only 5 loads at a time
Hammer Cocked on Firearm	Do not cock firearm until immediately engaging target
Direction of fire	Never point your firearm at anyone or equine, make 100% sure what you are shooting at
Dropped Firearm	Please inform Range Master of dropped firearm and allow them to pick it up
Misfire & Unspent rounds	Immediately inform armor of misfires do not fire rounds in arena after run. Discharge of unspent round will result in a non-qualified run 60 sec rule# 17a&b
Ground Condition	Ride according to ground conditions. Loose footing, wet spots
Open Gates	Check to make sure that all gates are closed before beginning your run
Balloon setters	Check to make sure that all balloon setters have cleared the arena before beginning your run
Arena Official "RANGEMASTER"	Do not begin run until Range Master official's flag is raised. Check the arena yourself. Ensure the course is clear of balloon setters prior to go.
Proximity of Spectators	Direct line of fire away from spectators or at a safe distance minimum 20 feet.
Ricochet off of barrels	Be aware that powder may ricochet off of barrel, wear safety glasses
Ear Protection	Ear plugs are recommended for horse and human. Remember that your horse can't hear as well; let them know when you're coming up to them.
Drug and Alcohol	Zero tolerance for drug or alcohol prior to and during event
Horse Hazards	Must inform other members of horse's behavior habits. e.g., kicking, biting, cycling mares, stud, red ribbon. Identify any new Horses to shooting
Arena Entry & Exit Area	Please keep the entry and exit area clear of riders, horses & people for the safety of everyone – people & equine
Clean Up	Please clean up after both yourself and your horse (s) in all locations to ensure we have clean riding & walking areas.
Wranglers	Peewee, Novice, Junior, see attached Wrangler Waiver for Divisions and information. It is strongly recommended that all wranglers wear a helmet. No participant under 18 years of age shall fire ANY firearm while mounted at any practice, jackpot, clinic or competition.

Canadian Cowboy Mounted Shooting Association 2017 WRANGLER Program

NEW: We have updated the 3 classifications of Wrangler Membership in CCMSA to improve cohesiveness with the CMSA USA Wrangler points tracking system and to still abide by our differing Canadian Firearms Laws. Our goal is to train and prepare our youth for full competition starting at age 18 in Canada and age 12 in the USA

The following applies to practices, competition and demonstrations

- ✓ Pylon cones will be placed to direct wranglers through courses.
- ✓ Peewee, Novice and Junior A Wranglers will be briefed and walked through patterns on their horses prior to being timed.
- ✓ Parent must designate a guardian if they are absent for each shoot. The Wrangler must carry a letter with them like a PAL
- ✓ The range master has the final say in all instances.
- ✓ No participant under 18 years of age shall fire ANY firearm while mounted at any practice, jackpot, clinic or competition
- ✓ Kid may move up when deemed ready by the parent – however the Range Master has final input w/r/t safety at all shoots.
- ✓ No move backs so Wranglers should practice, practice practice!

Peewee Wrangler- Any child under the age of 18 as of the day after CMSA World Championships Oct 15th 2016.

- requires being lead through the course and
- automatically will score 60 seconds per run as per CMSA Rules and
- will NOT participate shooting on the ground.

Novice Wrangler- Any child under the age of 18 as of the day after CMSA World Championships Oct 15th 2016

- will ride thru the course with no assistance and
- engage targets as per the CMSA rulebook regarding Wranglers and
- will NOT participate shooting on the ground and
- have holsters and at least 1 cap gun is encouraged and
- scoring as per CMSA Wrangler rules

Junior Wrangler- Any child under the age of 18 as of the day after CMSA World Championships Oct 15th 2016

- will be briefed on the course and will participate in course walk through patterns on horse prior to being timed
- qualifies by a demonstration of skill and
- is approved to shoot by the range master and
- will be wearing all proper attire for competition including hat, safety glasses, ear protection, chinks, holsters and
- will shoot all balloons from the ground with TWO hands, with-in arms distance and in direct supervision of a shooter with valid Restricted Pal
- penalties are the same as adult counterparts, as per decision by range master and
- scoring as per CMSA Wrangler rules and
- the competitor must hold a current CCMSA Family Membership
- **This membership requires 2 signatures of parent(s)/legal guardian(s) that they understand the child will be ground shooting as a Junior A Wrangler.**
